

Instructions for the Paper and Presentation

To ensure productive discussions during the course and for all participants to benefit as much as possible for their work, each of you will write a methodology-focused paper. It should begin with a brief introduction to the study to which the methodology section is relevant. The main focus of the paper should be on your choice of digital methods, how you justify them, and what advantages and disadvantages you see with the chosen method. Discuss your chosen method in relation to the course literature. Ideally, Your paper can conclude with a short section where you specify any questions you would like addressed during your presentation. The paper should be between 1000 and 1500 words long and written in English.

Submit your paper no later than 18th October to linnea.jensdotter@ctr.lu.se.

A total of 30 minutes will be allocated for each paper. The time will be divided so that each participant begins with a five-minute introduction to their paper followed by comments and discussion. It is assumed that everyone will read all the papers and be prepared to actively participate in the paper discussions. However, each paper will be read particularly carefully by an assigned "doctoral commentator" and by one of the more senior participants. This means that each of you will present and discuss your project and also serve as a commentator on a colleague's text. The discussion session will focus on kindly, constructively, and critically discussing the methodological issues raised in the paper. More detailed instructions on structuring your comments on each other's papers will follow later

Summary:

- Write a paper that includes an introduction to your study, a discussion of your methodological choices based on the course literature, and a concluding section with the opportunity to raise specific requests regarding the discussion.
- The paper should be between 1000 and 1500 words long and be written in English.
- Submit your paper by 18th October.
- You will have five minutes to present your paper during the presentation.
- Each paper will be assigned two specific commentators (one of whom will be a doctoral student).
- Everyone is expected to read all papers and to participate kindly, constructively, and critically in the discussions.
